Note: Additional colleges not included on this list may have “smoke-free campus” policies prohibiting smoking on campus without addressing other forms of tobacco use. Prohibiting cigarette smoking only may lead to the unintended consequence of increased use of “smokeless tobacco” products, which are being heavily marketed by the tobacco industry to young adults and others for use in settings where smoking is not allowed. Because these products are not safe alternatives to smoking, it is important that they be addressed in campus policies and related educational activities.
